SCENIC RIM COMMUNITY CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE CHAIR'S SUMMARY



Chair's summary

The third meeting of the Scenic Rim Community Consultative Committee (the committee) was held in Peak Crossing on Wednesday 30 May, 2018.

This Chair's summary provides an overview of the committee meeting and ensures that information is shared with the community at the earliest opportunity. It is a precursor to the formal meeting record, the committee meeting minutes, which will be published on the Inland Rail website following preparation and endorsement by the committee Chair.

Kathy Bensted, Chair The meeting was chaired by Ms Kathy Bensted and attended by 10 of the 13 local community representatives, appointed as members of the committee.

A total of 25 observers attended the meeting including Scenic Rim Regional Council. Division 6 Councillor. Duncan McInnes.

The purpose of the meeting was to give a project update and to share an overview of the consultation process taking place along the Calvert to Kagaru study corridor.

Presentations were provided by the ARTC Senior Project Manager for the Calvert to Kagaru (C2K) project, the ARTC Queensland Environment Manager and the Future Freight Joint Venture (FFJV) Social Impact Assessment (SIA) Specialist.

Information provided to the committee included:

- An overview of the EIS technical studies to take place over the next 12 18 months.
- Presentation of alternative alignments through the Teviot Range for which ARTC is seeking community feedback.
- Presentation of the current consultation taking place for the Calvert to Kagaru project.
- Presentation of the Social Impact Assessment being undertaken as part of the Environmental Impact Study and sharing of the social impact survey available to all community members via the Inland Rail website.

Committee members raised the following items during the meeting:

- Desire for ARTC to more widely advertise community consultation opportunities.
- Desire for ARTC to more actively engage with Traditional Owners and stakeholders directly affected by the alternative range crossings.
- ▶ A need for committee members to actively encourage their networks to participate in community consultation activities.

Members agreed that the next committee meeting would be held at Rosewood on Thursday 6 September. Venue to be determined, based on availability. The meeting details will be advertised and promoted by ARTC to encourage observers to attend future meetings.
