Chair's Summary



Lockyer Valley Community Consultative Committee

The 12th meeting of the Lockyer Valley Community Consultative Committee (CCC) was held at the Lockyer Valley Cultural Centre in Gatton on Tuesday, 20 April 2021.

This Chair's summary provides an overview of the Committee meeting regarding particularly the Helidon to Calvert (H2C) public exhibition of the draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).

The Committee meeting minutes will be published on the Inland Rail website following preparation and endorsement by the Committee Chair.

The meeting was chaired by Simon Warner and attended by 10 of the 15 local community representatives, appointed as members of the Committee. Five apologies were made by Committee members. A total of eight observers also attended the meeting.

In general business, Gordon Van der Est on behalf of the Forest Hill Community Development Association, requested further information from ARTC and a review of the grade separation in Forest Hill.

The Chair advised that at this point the most appropriate action was for the community to make a submission to the Office of the Coordinator General and encouraged the Forest Hill Community to progress with an EIS submission.
