## 1 Introduction

## 1.1 Background

Australian Rail Track Corporation (ARTC) prepared an Environment Report as a requirement under the Victorian Environment Effects Act 1979 (EE Act) and the Commonwealth Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act) Assessment of the Project and the Environment Report was undertaken by the Victorian State Government under the Bilateral Agreement to avoid process duplication and enable integration and efficient consideration of relevant Commonwealth and Victoria government matters.

The Environment Report was prepared in accordance with:

- Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) (now Department of Environment, Energy and Climate Action (DEECA)) scoping document
- The requirements of condition (a) of the Minister for Planning's decision on the Project, made on 23 August 2020, under section 8B (3) of the EE act
- The requirements of item 5 of schedule 1 of the Bilateral Agreement.

The primary focus of the Environment Report was to address the scoping requirements contained within Scope for the Environment Report under EPBC Act Bilateral (Assessment) Agreement 2014 and the EE Act (the 'scoping document') by examining the impacts of the Project on native vegetation, habitat and biodiversity values associated with listed threatened species and communities, as well as describe any feasible alternatives and mitigation measures that could avoid or reduce relevant impacts.

The Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (DCCEEW) issued a notice of approval for the project on 26 September 2022 and ARTC commenced works shortly after. EPBC vegetation clearing did occur during the reporting period. A copy of the approval can be found in Appendix B.

## 1.2 Scope

This report details the commitments outlined within EPBC 2020/8721 and assessment of compliance against conditions 1-31 for the reporting period 26 September 2022 to 25 September 2023 as per Conditions 19 through to 22 of EPBC 2020/8721, which states:

- 19. The approval holder must prepare a **compliance report** for each 12-month period following the date of this approval, or as otherwise agreed by the **Minister**.
- 20. Each compliance report must be consistent with the Annual Compliance Report Guidelines.
- 21. Each compliance report must include:
  - a. Accurate and complete details of compliance and any non-compliance with the conditions and the **plans**, and any **incidents**.
  - b. One or more **shapefile** (s) showing all **clearing** of any **protected matters**, and/or their habitat, undertaken within the 12-month period at the end of which that **compliance report** is prepared.
  - c. A schedule of all **plans** in existence in relation to these conditions and accurate and complete details of how each plan is being implemented.
- 22. The approval holder must:
  - a. Publish each **compliance report** on the **website** within 60 **business days** following the end of the 12-month period for which that **compliance report** is required.
  - b. Notify the **department** electronically, within 5 **business days** of the date of publication that a **compliance report** has been published on the **website**.
  - c. Provide the weblink for the compliance report in the notification to the department.
  - d. Keep all published **compliance reports** required by these conditions on the **website** until the expiry date of this approval.
  - e. Exclude or redact **sensitive ecological data** from **compliance reports** published on the **website** or otherwise provided to a member of the public.
  - f. If sensitive ecological data is excluded or redacted from the published version, submit the full compliance report to the department within 5 business days of its publication on the



**website** and notify the **department** in writing what exclusions and redactions have been made in the version published on the website.

## 1.3 Approved action

To conduct upgrades along the existing North East Line, Inland Rail between Beverage and Albury in Victoria. Works consist of twelve enhancement sites and multiple powerline sites and track slews. The works are being delivered in two Tranches. The first Tranche consists of Seymour-Avenel Road Seymour, Beaconsfield Parade Glenrowan, Wangaratta Station Precinct Wangaratta and Murrey Valley Highway Barnawartha North. The remaining eight sites will be delivered in Tranche 2.

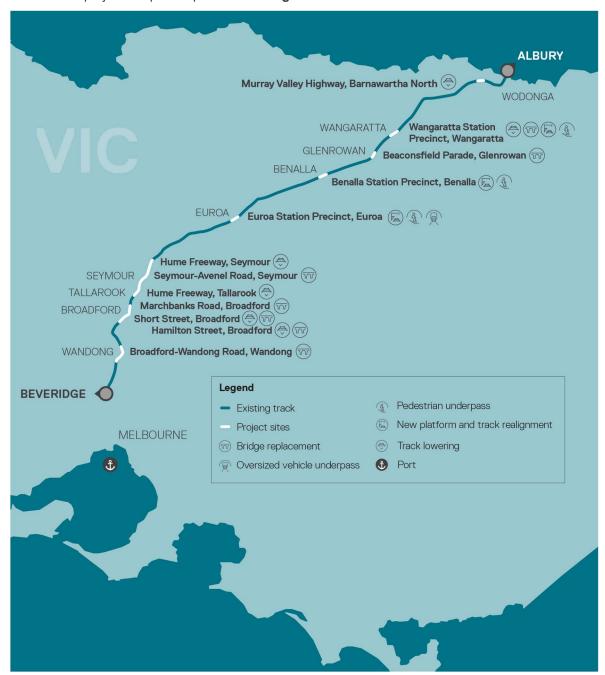


Figure 1: Beveridge to Albury section of Inland Rail project footprint

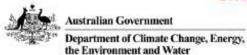

- 5. Within 9 months of the date of this approval, the approval holder must:
  - a. secure the offset area; and
  - submit written evidence demonstrating that the offset area has been secured to the department; and
  - c. submit shapefiles and offset attributes for the offset area to the department.
- 6. If the approval holder wishes to carry out any activity within the offset area other than in accordance with the Offset Management Plan, the approval holder must submit a revised version of the Offset Management Plan to the department for the Minister's written approval. The approval holder must not commence the varied activity until the Minister has approved the revised Offset Management Plan in writing.
- 7. For the protections of protected matters, the approval holder must comply with the Environment Management Framework required under the Inland Rail-Beveridge to Albury, December 2021 Incorporated Document in the Whittlesea, Mitchell, Strathbogie, Benalla, Wangaratta and Wodonga planning schemes to the extent it relates to the relevant protected matters, as in force or existing from time to time.

### SUBMISSION AND PUBLICATION OF PLANS

- The approval holder must, when submitting all plans required by these conditions, provide them electronically to the department.
- Unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the Minister, the approval holder must publish each plan on the website within 15 business days of the date:
  - a. of this approval, if the version of the plan to be implemented is specified in these conditions; or
  - a plan revised under these conditions is approved by the Minister; or
  - c. the plan is approved by a Victorian Government official as required under state government legislation which must be complied with in accordance with these EPBC Act conditions.

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- The approval holder must keep all plans required by these conditions published on the website until the expiry date of this approval.
- The approval holder is required to exclude or redact sensitive ecological data from plans
  published on the website or otherwise provided to a member of the public.
- 12. If sensitive ecological data is excluded or redacted from a plan in accordance with condition 10, the approval holder must notify the department in writing what exclusions and redactions have been made in the version published on the website.

### PART B - ADMINISTRATIVE CONDITIONS

### NOTIFICATION OF DATE OF COMMENCEMENT OF THE ACTION

- The approval holder must notify the department electronically of the date of commencement of the Action, within 5 business days of commencement of the Action.
- 14. If the commencement of the Action does not occur within 5 years from the date of this approval, then the approval holder must not commence the Action without the prior written agreement of the Minister.

### COMPLIANCE RECORDS

- 15. The approval holder must maintain accurate and complete compliance records.
- If the department makes a request in writing, the approval holder must provide electronic copies of compliance records to the department within the timeframe specified in the request.

Note: Compliance records may be subject to audit by the department, or by an independent auditor in accordance with section 458 of the EPBC Act, and/or be used to verify compliance with the conditions. Summaries of the results of an audit may be published on the department's website or through the general media.

- 17. The approval holder must ensure that any monitoring data (including sensitive ecological data), surveys, maps, and other spatial and metadata required under the conditions of this approval are prepared in accordance with the Guide to providing maps and boundary data for EPBC Act projects.
- 18. The approval holder must submit all monitoring data (including sensitive ecological data), surveys, maps, other spatial and metadata and all species occurrence record data (sightings and evidence of presence) electronically to the department in accordance with the requirements of the offset management plan.

### ANNUAL COMPLIANCE REPORTING

- The approval holder must prepare a compliance report for each 12-month period following the date of this approval, or as otherwise agreed to in writing by the Minister.
- Each compliance report must be consistent with the Annual Compliance Report Guidelines.
- 21. Each compliance report must include:
  - Accurate and complete details of compliance and any non-compliance with the conditions and the plans, and any incidents.
  - b. One or more shapefile(s) showing all clearing of any protected matters, and/or their habitat, undertaken within the 12-month period at the end of which that compliance report is prepared.
  - c. A schedule of all plans in existence in relation to these conditions and accurate and complete details of how each plan is being implemented.

### 22. The approval holder must:

- a. Publish each compliance report on the website within 60 business days following the end of the 12-month period for which that compliance report is required.
- b. Notify the department electronically, within 5 business days of the date of publication that a compliance report has been published on the website.
- Provide the weblink for the compliance report in the notification to the department.

- d. Keep all published compliance reports required by these conditions on the website until the expiry date of this approval.
- Exclude or redact sensitive ecological data from compliance reports published on the website or otherwise provided to a member of the public,
- f. If sensitive ecological data is excluded or redacted from the published version, submit the full compliance report to the department within 5 business days of its publication on the website and notify the department in writing what exclusions and redactions have been made in the version published on the website.

Note: Compliance reports may be published on the department's website.

### REPORTING NON-COMPLIANCE

- 23. The approval holder must notify the department electronically, within 2 business days of becoming aware of any incident and/or potential non-compliance and/or actual noncompliance with the conditions or commitments made in a plan.
- 24. The approval holder must specify in the notification:
  - Any condition or commitment made in a plan which has been or may have been breached.
  - A short description of the incident and/or potential non-compliance and/or actual noncompliance.
  - c. The location (including co-ordinates), date, and time of the incident and/or potential non-compliance and/or actual non-compliance.

Note: If the exact information cannot be provided, the approval holder must provide the best information available.

- 25. The approval holder must provide to the department in writing, within 12 business days of becoming aware of any incident and/or potential non-compliance and/or actual noncompliance, the details of that incident and/or potential non-compliance and/or actual noncompliance with the conditions or commitments made in a plan. The approval holder must specify:
  - a. Any corrective action or investigation which the approval holder has already taken
  - The potential impacts of the incident and/or non-compliance
  - The method and timing of any corrective action that will be undertaken by the approval holder.

### INDEPENDENT AUDIT

- 26. The approval holder must ensure that an independent audit of compliance with the conditions is conducted for every three-year period following the commencement of the Action until this approval expires, unless otherwise specified in writing by the Minister.
- 27. For each independent audit, the approval holder must:
  - a. Provide the name and qualifications of the nominated independent auditor, the draft audit criteria, and proposed timeframe for submitting the audit report to the department prior to commencing the independent audit.
  - b. Only commence the independent audit once the nominated independent auditor, audit criteria and timeframe for submitting the audit report have been approved in writing by the department.
  - c. Submit the audit report to the department for approval within the timeframe specified and approved in writing by the department.



- d. Publish each audit report on the website within 15 business days of the date of the department's approval of the audit report.
- e. Keep every audit report published on the website until this approval expires.
- 28. Each audit report must report for the three-year period preceding that audit report.
- Each audit report must be completed to the satisfaction of the Minister and be consistent
  with the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 Independent Audit and
  Audit Report Guidelines, Commonwealth of Australia 2019, or any subsequent official version.

### COMPLETION OF THE ACTION

- 30. The approval holder must notify the department electronically 60 business days prior to the expiry date of this approval, that the approval is due to expire.
- 31. Within 20 business days after the completion of the Action, and, in any event, before this approval expires, the approval holder must notify the department electronically of the date of completion of the Action and provide completion data.

#### PART C - DEFINITIONS

In these conditions any bolded use of a word or term refers to the below definition of that word or term:

Annual Compliance Report Guidelines means the Annual Compliance Report Guidelines, Commonwealth of Australia 2014, or the current official subsequent version.

Audit report means a written report of compliance and fulfilment of the conditions attached to this approval, objectively evaluated against the audit criteria approved by the department.

Business day means a day that is not a Saturday, a Sunday or a public holiday in the state or territory of the Action.

Clear, cleared or clearing means the cutting down, felling, thinning, logging, removing, killing, destroying, poisoning, ringbarking, uprooting, or burning of vegetation.

Commence the Action or Commencement of the Action means the date on which the first instance of any activity associated with the Action (including clearing and construction) is undertaken. Commencement of the Action does not include minor physical disturbance necessary to:

- Undertake pre-clearance surveys or monitoring programs.
- Install signage and /or temporary fencing to prevent unapproved use of the project area.
- c. Protect environmental and property assets from fire, weeds, and feral animals, including use of existing surface access tracks.
- d. Install temporary site facilities for persons undertaking pre-commencement activities so long as these are located where they have no impact on any protected matter.

Completion data means an environmental report and spatial data clearly detailing how the conditions of this approval have been met. The department's chosen format for spatial data is a shapefile.

Completion of the Action means the date on which all activities associated with this approval have permanently ceased and/or been completed.

Compliance records means all documentation or other material in whatever form required to demonstrate compliance with the conditions of approval in the approval holder's possession, or that are within the approval holder's power to obtain lawfully.

Compliance report means a written report of compliance with, and fulfilment of, the conditions attached to the approval.

Construction means the erection of a building or structure that is, or is to be, fixed to the ground and wholly or partially fabricated on-site; the alteration, maintenance, repair or demolition of any building or structure; any work which involves breaking of the ground (including pile driving) or bulk earthworks; the laying of pipes and other prefabricated materials in the ground, and any associated excavation work; but excluding the installation of temporary fences and signage.

Department means the Australian Government agency responsible for administering the EPBC Act.

Environment Management Framework means the Inland Rail – Environment Management Framework - Australian Rail Track Corporation Ltd prepared to the satisfaction of the Victorian Minister for Planning.

EPBC Act means the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (Cth).

Grey box woodlands means the EPBC Act listed threatened ecological community Grey Box (Eucalyptus microcarpa) Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands of South-eastern Australia.

Grey Box woodland impact areas means the areas represented by the brown shaded polygons labelled 'Impacted Grey Box (Eucalyptus macrocarpa) Grassy Woodlands and Derived Native Grasslands of South-Eastern Australia community' in Attachment A maps 1-10.

Guide to providing maps and boundary data for EPBC Act projects means the Guide to providing maps and boundary data for EPBC Act projects, Commonwealth of Australia 2021, or any subsequent official version.

Incident means any event which has the potential to, or does, impact on any protected matter.

Incorporated Document means the document titled Inland Rail-Beveridge to Albury

December 2021, incorporated into relevant planning schemes by Amendment GC157 under
the Planning and Environment Act 1987 (Vic).

Independent means a person or firm who does not have any individual, financial\*, employment\* or family affiliation or any conflicting interests with the project, the approval holder or the approval holder's staff, representatives or associated persons.

\*Other than for the purpose of undertaking the role for which an independent person is required

Independent audit means an audit conducted by an independent and suitably qualified person as detailed in the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 Independent Audit and Audit Report Guidelines, Commonwealth of Australia 2019, or any subsequent official version.

Minister means the Australian Government Minister administering the EPBC Act, including any delegate thereof.

Monitoring data means the data required to be recorded under the conditions of this approval.

Offset attributes means an '.xls' file capturing relevant attributes of the offset site, including the EPBC reference ID number, the physical address of the offset site, coordinates of the boundary points in decimal degrees, the protected matter that the offset compensates for, and any additional protected matters that are benefiting from the offset, and the size of the offset in hectares.

Offset area means the location of the action, represented in <u>Attachment B</u> by the polygons enclosed by the solid blue lines labelled 'Site Boundary'.

Offset Management Plan means the Inland Rail – Beveridge to Albury EPBC Offset

Management Plan 1 July 2022 Australian Rail Track Corporation Ltd or a subsequent version currently approved by the Minister in writing.

Plan means any action management plan or strategy that the approval holder is required by these conditions to implement, including but not limited to the Offset Management Plan and the Environment Management Framework.

Project area means the location of the action, represented in <u>Attachment A</u> maps 1-10 by the polygons enclosed by the solid orange lines labelled 'Overhead Powerline Project Areas' and the polygons enclosed by the dashed black lines labelled 'Enhancement Site Reference Design Impact Area'.

Protected matter means a matter protected under a controlling provision in Part 3 of the EPBC Act for which this approval has effect.

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Sensitive ecological data means data as defined in the Australian Government Department of the Environment Sensitive Ecological Data – Access and Management Policy V1.0, Commonwealth of Australia 2016, or any subsequent official version.

Secure (also secured) means to establish and register a covenant for the long-term protection of the offset area under a section 69 agreement under the Conservation, Forests and Lands Act 1987 (Vic), or another enduring protection mechanism agreed to in writing by the Minister.

Shapefile(s) means location and attribute information about the Action provided in an Esri shapefile format. Shapefiles must contain '.shp', '.shx', '.dbf' files and a '.prj' file that specifies the projection/geographic coordinate system used. Shapefiles must also include an '.xml' metadata file that describes the shapefile for discovery and identification purposes.

Suitably qualified person means a person who has professional qualifications, training, skills and/or experience related to the nominated subject matter and can give authoritative independent assessment, advice and analysis on performance relative to the subject matter using the relevant protocols, standards, methods and/or literature.

Website means a set of related web pages located under a single domain name attributed to the approval holder and available to the public.

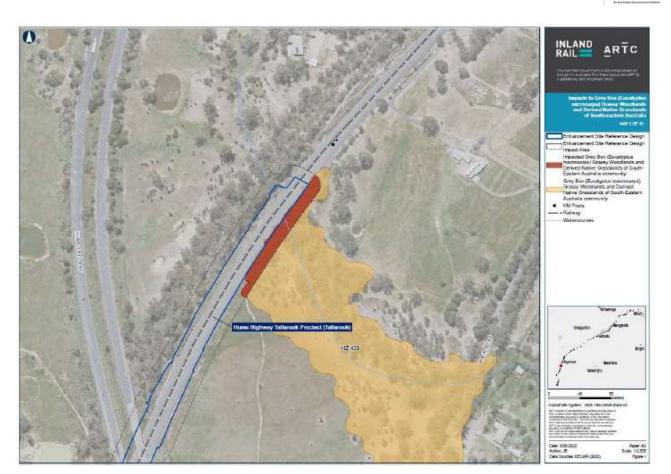
1. Attachment A - Grey Box woodland impact areas, maps 1 - 10



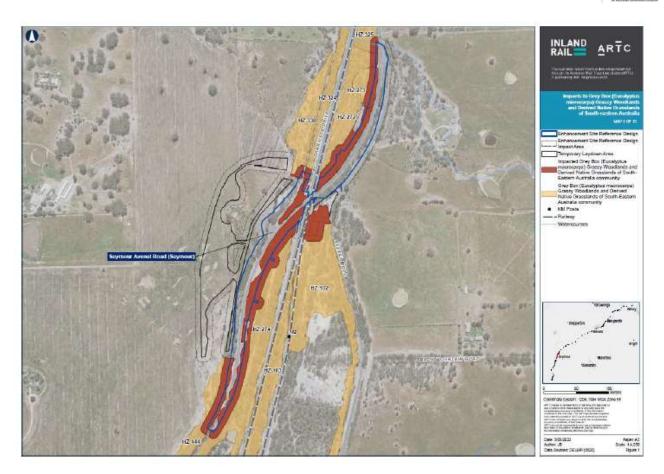






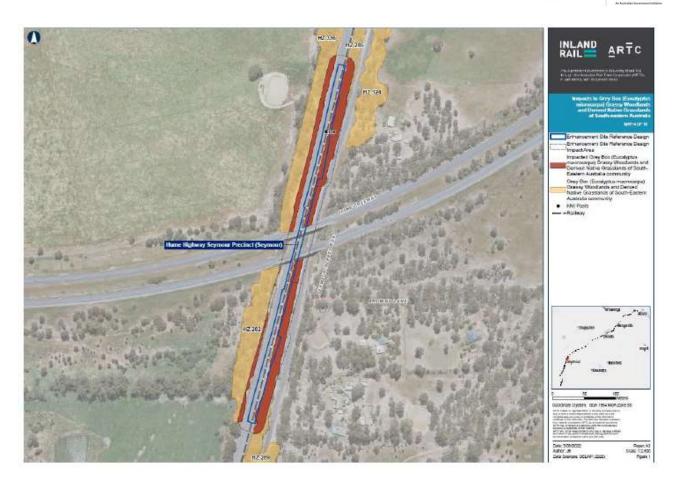
















































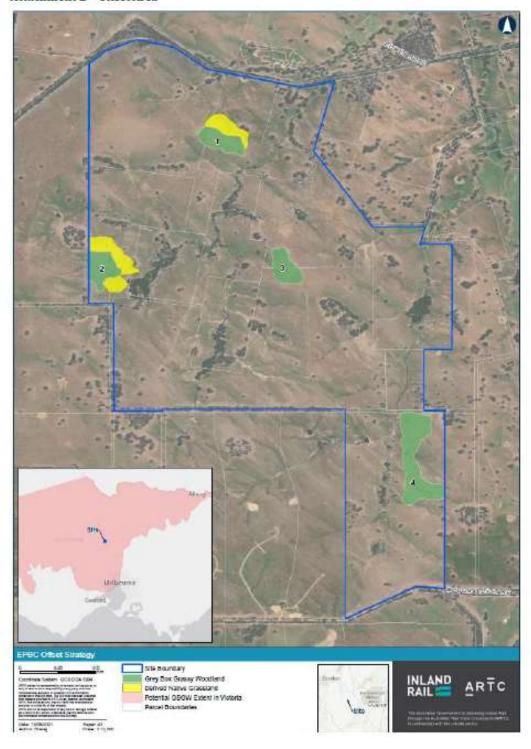
